



Safety Moment

First Aid Kits and Evacuation Planning

- Include possible emergency situations in event planning
- **Review most likely injuries and tailor first aid kits**
- Plan for first aid kits to be accessible
- **Review parts A, B, and C of each Scout's health form**
- **Consider how to deal with worst case scenarios:**
 - What do you need to stabilize the injured person?
 - How can you call for help?
 - Who do you call for help?
- Share this information with all Scouts and Scouters participating

Positive Childhood Experiences (PCEs)

Research tell us that PCEs such as:

- Having supportive relationships with trusted adults
- Feeling safe and seen in the community
- Participating in meaningful group activities
- And having chances to contribute and grow...
- ... are key to developing well-rounded, emotionally healthy youth.





Commissioner's Minute

PCEs in Scouting

- Scouts build connections with caring, consistent mentors. They experience a deep sense of belonging within their pack, troop,
- crew, post, or ship.
- They face challenges that foster confidence, responsibility, and growth.
- They give back through service developing purpose, empathy, and civic engagement.

These experiences aren't just nice to have – they're protective. They

buffer youth against stress, reduce the impact of trauma, and build the

foundation for lifelong well-being.
