YPT Expiration

- Youth Protection Training (YPT) expires on May 31, regardless of when you last took it.
- Safeguarding Youth Training (SYT) is the new course, replacing YPT, that must be taken by all adult leaders.
- Annual refresher course is now available for leaders who have already taken SYT, it must be completed before your SYT expires or you have to take the full course all over again.

Community Visibility: Do people know that Scouting is in their area?

- Highlight work in our communities: food drives, park clean-ups, other civic matters.
- Each unit would benefit from having one adult who can perform this duty for the unit's activities.
- All it takes is a few well composed pictures and a short story about what the unit is doing.
- Photo releases are included in a Scout's annual health and medical record. To be safe, try to identify them as Scouts without showing their faces.

May Hot Topic: Scouter Code of Conduct (Abridged)

On my honor I promise to do my best to comply with this Scouting America Scouter Code of Conduct while serving in my capacity as an adult leader:

- I will do my best to live the Scout Oath and Scout Law and hold others accountable
- I will make the protection of youth a personal priority
- When transporting Scouts, I will obey all laws, comply with SYT guidelines
- I will respect and abide by the Rules and Regulations of Scouting America
- I will not discuss/engage in any form of sexual conduct while engaged in Scouting
- I confirm that I have fully disclosed and will disclose criminal activity or misconduct
- I will not possess, distribute, transport, consume, use alcohol/firearms/pornography
- If I am taking prescription medications with the potential of impairing my functioning or judgment, I will not engage in activities that would put Scouts at risk
- I will take steps to prevent or report any violation of this code

Safety Moment: The Game of Safety

DO NOT ANNOUNCE HERE IS THE SAFETY MOMENT: Time to make Safety Fun!

- Do this instead: Give everyone in the room a colored dot and ask them to stick it somewhere inconspicuous (don't put it on the front of the shirt-but on your back, your sleeve, your shoe, etc.) and do not talk about your sticker with anyone.
- When it is time for your safety moment tell everyone in the room, they need to find a partner as fast as they can-catch is they have to have the same color sticker as you.
- Then watch the fun begin as everyone starts looking for their dot color to find a partner. This is an uncomplicated way to talk about being aware of who is around, the importance of having a buddy, and situational awareness and safety.
- If you are inclined, give the first five teams a treat or prize for being aware of the people around them.
